Engineering Challenges of Non-Traditional Glass

Cathy Claycomb will discuss the engineering behind her non-traditional stained glass techniques and unique design concepts including invisible reinforcement, floating rondels, surface embellishment, free standing glass and more.

Tiffany, LaFarge and their early 20th Century counterparts were responsible for the masterpieces of glass art that inspired us. Today's glass artists have taken that inspiration to new and exciting heights and unprecedented levels of spectacular beauty. WORKSHOPS - open to all levels from beginners to advanced

Tranchant du Verre (Palette Knife Glass)

- Michael Dupille - \$60 (3 hrs)
The English translation from French roughly means 'the knife edge of glass'. This unique process is based on traditional palette knife painting using oils or acrylics. By using powdered glass with a suspension medium, in this case Vitrigel, create imagery with glass in ways that were previously in the realm of traditional painting mediums for canvas. These can be altered, added to and embellished using various kiln formed glass techniques and processes. The possibilities are unlimited. Materials fee: 25.00

Molds: How and Why

Lisa Richardson Bach - \$60 (3 hrs) Interested in making your own 3 dimensional pieces in glass? Tired of the shapes and styles of conventional molds? Do you have a mold that needs some pizzazz? Have a shape that you like but there is nothing out there like it? Try your hand at a small casting mold. This hands-on class is for you! It will cover the use of fiber paper and fiber board to create your own mold or to alter production molds. Adjustments to firing cycles for each mold style will be discussed. Materials fee: 25.00

Paint, Paint and more Paint

Faint, Faint and more Paint - Lisa Richardson Bach - \$60 (3 hrs)This class will explore the many products out there including, but not limited to: Hues to Fuse, Colorline, Unique Colors, Glassline, enamels and much more. There will be examples showing how the paints look fired. Students will then get a chance to work with many of the products to understand the feel and difference in applications. Whether using paints as an accent, a detail or a full image, this class will show you how to achieve whatever you have designed. No painting skills required! \$25 materials fee.

"Fantasy Botanical" Glass Mosaics

-Robin Anderson - \$60 (3 hrs).
This is a great "let's just have fun" class for all skill levels. Students will complete two mosaic projects and will take home lots of wonderful ideas for future projects with new skills. We're going to have a wonderful, messy, good time! \$25 materials fee.

Working with Alcohol Inks

- Cathy Claycomb - \$60 (3 hrs)
Combine a blank slate of headglass with a pattern, and turn ordinary stained glass into a painterly masterpiece! Learn mask cutting and a simple etching process that provides a base for color that blends and leeches together in a totally new and fascinating way! \$25 materials fee

Beautiful World of Cabochons

Lisa Richardson Bach - \$60 (3 hrs)Learn three different techniques to make unique pieces that can be incorporated into jewelry, fused pieces and Stained Glass pieces. We will cover simple stack cabs, cut and fire polish cabs, and casting cabs. Students will be able to cut cabs to take home and fire polish. Cabochons will be available for incorporating in the beaded jewelry class. \$20 material fee.

Mokume Gane - Polymer Clay Technique

- Marina Jennings - \$60 (3 hrs)
Learn to mimic traditional Japanese metalworking technique and manipulate layers of polymer clay and metal leaf to create endless combinations of color and striking design patterns. This process can be used to create a variety of jewelry and decorative items limited only by your imagination. Materials and tools for several project options will be provided. \$20 materials fee.

Thinking outside the Box!

- Cathy Claycomb - \$60 (3 hrs)
Learn from an award winning artist. Design contemporary glass artwork without the constraints of lead, solder, flux or came! This class will celebrate and incorporate iridized, textured, flapped, crimped, marked or bubbled glass to produce your own one of a kind creation. \$25 materials fee includes a custom frame.

Fun with Vitrigel!

- Michael Dupille - \$60 (3 hrs)

Pioneer glass fuser Michael Dupille has developed the latest rendition in glass mediums. Vitrigel is an easy to use organic material that mixes with water to form a gel like consistency. Add powdered glass and the design possibilities are endless. Create parts, textures, lines or use a palette knife for wonderful kiln formed effects. Make a frit sandwich and bring it home to fire. A great time for all! No experience required. Materials fee: 25.00

Beaded Kumihimo

-Marina Jennings - \$60 (3 hrs)

A perfect introduction to the ancient art of Japanese braiding. Learn this simple yet versatile technique and how to use it to create a variety of beaded cords that are beautiful on their own or as a way to showcase your beaded or wire-wrapped cabochons. All materials and tools are provided. You will take home a finished bracelet, braiding disk and step by step instructions. \$20 materials

Beaded Cabochon Bezel

- Marina Jennings, Lisa Richardson Bach - \$60 (3hrs)
Learn an easy and versatile bead weaving technique and create a beaded bezel for a fused cabochon to use as a pendant or a bracelet focal point. Bring your own cabochon or choose from a selection available in class. Materials in a variety of colors and all necessary tools are provided along with detailed instructions. \$15 materials fee does not include cabochon.
